

### **PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE PLACEMENT**

Students undertaking IHM's Master of Nursing course oncampus or through blended mode of delivery may choose to undertake the Professional Experience Placement unit which aims to provide opportunities for students to demonstrate consolidation of new knowledge, newly acquired skills and professional behaviours in the provision of safe, personcentred and culturally appropriate care as a member of the multi-disciplinary healthcare team. Students must write their clinical objectives/goals using a learning contract which has to be approved by their clinical educator. Students need to submit reflective journals on clinical themes from their work experience such as describing clinical issues, ethical dilemmas, criticalincidents, exploring one's own feelings, critically analysing the incidents and drawing conclusions in relation to whether they met their set clinical goals. The clinical educator will supervise and assess the students' performance.

## MASTER OF NURSING

The Master of Nursing is an AQF level 9 course. It builds on the knowledge and skills gained by nurses in the Bachelor of Nursing or an equivalent course/program. The Master of Nursing is designed to prepare graduate nurses for emerging clinical roles, beginning research roles and educational and leadership and management positions.

The course is delivered in a variety of learning and teaching modes including face-to-face, online, and full or part-time, providing flexibility for students to balance work and family commitments with their study requirements.

### **ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS**

To be eligible for admission to the Master of Nursing course an applicant is required to:

- Have completed a Bachelor of Nursing degree or an equivalent qualification;
- Be an AHPRA registered nurse; or
- Be a registered nurse with the Nurses' Board/Council from the country of origin or place of residence and must have English Language proficiency as evidenced by:
- an IELTS level of at least 6.5 with no band less than 6, or equivalent scores in OET/ PTE/other recognised English examination; or
- direct entry through a pass in English for Academic Purpose (EAP) course with the minimum score of 70%.



### **VOLUME OF LEARNING** AND STUDENT WORK LOAD

A full-time student will be expected to undertake 128 credit points over a period of two years. A parttime student will undertake 128 credit points over a period of four years.

### **MAXIMUM CREDIT**

The Master of Nursing course has 128 credit points. Maximum credit allowed for the recognition of prior learning/credit transfer will be 64 credit points.

- IHM students with a Graduate Certificate in Nursing may gain up to 32 credit points (25%) towards the Master of Nursing course.
- IHM students with a Graduate Diploma in Nursing may gain up to 64 credit points (50%) towards the Master of Nursing course.
- Students from other universities who apply and successfully obtain recognition of prior learning (RPL), must complete at least 50% of the course at IHM to be eligible to receive the IHM Master of Nursing

### **COURSE LEARNING OUTCOMES**

### **UNITS**

The Master of Nursing Students must undertake and complete successfully 9 core units, 2 compulsory units and 1 elective unit within the first three semesters. One of the two electives N9003 Professional Reflection in Nursing or N9004 Professional Experience Placement has to be completed in the first semester by the student. In the final semester there is an option for the students to select either 3 theoretical units or a Nursing project.
